About Château Marcellus

Château Marcellus is a Historic French Château located in the Bordeaux region. The 35-hectares property dominates the beautiful Garonne Valley. Built between 1773 and 1775, Château Marcellus shows neo-classic architecture that reflects elegance and nobility. It features a large collection of antiques, sculptures, and architectural pieces from the 16th to the 19th century.



Henri IV, the founder of the Bourbon dynasty and King of France was one of the ancient owners of the Chateau Marcellus.





Heritage Treasures: In the 19th century, the Comte de Marcellus bought the famous Venus de Milo statue from the Turks in Constantinople and brought it to France. In gratitude, King Louis XVIII of France awarded him and commissioned the Louvre to make the first copy of the statue, which to this day exists in the possessions of the Marcellus family.


